

POST-SURGICAL INSTRUCTIONS

Do's

- 1. If you have stitches, Do wash wound with mild soap and water or an antiseptic solution such as chlorhexidine or iodine daily, dry the wound with a clean guaze and then cover with a clean dressing (e.g. a bandaid).
- 2. If you do not have stitches, Vaseline ung..... can be applied daily with a Q-tip or a clean washed finger.

Don'ts

- 1. Do not soak wound in a bath or a pool. You can shower the next day.
- 2. Do not take part in any exercise or exertion, which will overly stretch the wound.
- 3. Do not stop any blood thinners such as warfarin (coumarin) or aspirin unless told to do so by your dermatologist.

How to deal with discomfort or complications

- 1. **Pain**: Take Tylenol when required unless contraindicated.
- Bleeding: Press on wound firmly and continuously for 10 minutes using a clean gauze. Contact your dermatologist or emergency doctors if this fails to stop the bleeding.
- 3. **Infection**: If your wound becomes red with increasing pain, you will need to be assessed urgently by a doctor. The usual treatment is a one-week course of antibiotics (e.g. Keflex 500mg QID for an adult) by mouth. If your immune system is suppressed by medications or illness, you should seek help immediately.
- 4. **Wound Dehiscence**: This is the gaping open of the wound due to broken or loosen stitches. Only a wound of more than 1.5cm will require restitching.

Your stitches should be removed in _____ days. Please arrange for an appointment today with our office or with your family doctor. Please contact us for your biopsy result on 416-335-3376 if you haven't from us in 4 weeks. If you do not get your result, do NOT assume that the test result is normal.
